Support for Carers Program

The Victorian Government provides funding for services to connect with and deliver supports to carers in their local areas.

Carers provide an invaluable role so it is important they are seen, heard and supported in their own life too.

NDCH aim to connect with local carers and tailor supports to suit them best, whether in their home or in their comunity. We would love to hear from you and asisst you in easing your role as a carer.

Is there a fee?

This is a free service.

Who is eligible for this service?

Anyone who is an unpaid carer, of any age and an Australian resident is eligible for this service. If you receive a carer allowance or pension, you can still access this service.

NDCH Carer Respite Service

Northern District Community
Health aim to connect with carers
in all circumstances. Assisting
those most isolated, reducing
carer burn out and getting carers
engaged in their own life is of
great priority. NDCH provide
support and respite in a range of
ways. Respite particularly helps
care for you so you can continue
caring for someone else. The
service can plan support that
best suits your needs and the one
you care for, and could include:

- In-home respite
- Overnight respite
- Carer counselling
- Attending a Carer Support Group to connect with other carers
- Education and resources
- Financial assistance with goods or equipment.

No doctor referral needed.

Location of Service

The service is available to carers who live in the Buloke Shire, Gannawarra Shire, Loddon Shire & Swan Hill Shire. The person they care for may live outside these local government areas. If transport is an issue, we can come to you for a consultation.

What makes someone a carer?

Carers can give support to a relative or friend who has a disability, mental health problem, medical condition, palliative or is frail due to age. Carers are often children, parents, partners, relatives or friends who look after someone who needs help or assistance in daily life. They may also care for people from a distance, every so often, for emotional support or things like checking in on a neighbour.
